

### Get ready to make a splash at Marilla and Krepps

Though it's not officially summer until June 20, for many people, this weekend marks the start of summer.

Both Krepps and Marilla pools opened this weekend and are ready for swimmers and sunbathers. The pools will be open today and Monday but closed Tuesday-Friday, reopening Saturday through Aug. 11.

#### The pools

Located in the heart of Suncrest, near the WVU Coliseum, Krepps Pool features a pirate ship-themed aquatic play area for children 12 and under, diving board, concession stand, beach area and locker rooms.

BOPARC's largest pool is located in the Sabraton area of Morgantown. Marilla Pool features a zero-grade entry, two water slides, diving board, large beach area, concession stand and locker rooms.

The pools are open seven days a week

from noon-6 p.m.

Admission is \$6 for adults and \$5 for youth (ages 4-17) and seniors (55 and over). Slide passes at Marilla are an extra \$3 per rider.

Children 3 and under are free with a paying adult.

Sundays are discount days, saving each person \$1 all day at both pools. Slide bands are still \$3 on Sundays.

#### **Pool passes**

Pool passes can be purchased in person at the BOPARC Administrative Office in Sabraton from 9 a.m.-3 p.m. Monday-Friday or over the phone with a credit card. Passes are picture coded and require a driver's license-size photo at time of purchase. Take a photo(s) of all members of your party or be prepared to email (admin office@boparc.org) the pictures if paying over the phone. Passes will not be processed without a picture.

Family Pass (up to four people) is \$230. Each additional family member will be \$25 per person with a maximum of four additional people per family pass.

Individual Season Pass is \$130.

Pool Passes are valid at both pools for public sessions only. Individual programs have additional fees.

#### **Private events**

Both Krepps Pool and Marilla Pool can be reserved for a private event. Reservations may be made in one-hour or two-hour time blocks any day, depending on availability, between 6:30-8:30 p.m. Reservations include use of the pool, locker rooms, beach areas, pool pavilion (Marilla only), Aquatic Play Area (Krepps only) and lifeguards. Use of the water slides at Marilla is available for an additional rental fee. Renters are permitted to bring in their own refreshments, but no alcohol permitted.

Reservations can be made by calling 304-296-8356.

Pool rental is \$165 per hour with a maximum of two hours.

Slide rental at Marilla is \$100 per rental, also with a maximum of two hours.

#### **Pool rules & info**

- No diving in the shallow end of the pool, hanging on ropes or general horseplay, such as pushing, dunking or hanging on shoulders, waist or neck of other swimmers.
- No spitting in water, swearing or other inappropriate actions or language.
- No food permitted in or near the pool.
- Hard diving sticks, rings and hard balls (footballs, tennis balls) are prohibited.
- Snorkels, masks, flippers and flotation devices, such as water rings, rafts, beach balls and "swimmies," are prohibited.
- Only U.S. Coast Guard approved devices are permitted.
- Adult swim takes place at the top of every hour for 10 minutes. Adult swim is for 18 and over. Children are not permitted in the pool during adult swim. The final whistle is blown at 5:50 p.m. of each regular swim and at 7:50 p.m. of each evening swim.

### ADVENTURE OUTFITTERS

### Bikes, kayaks, paddleboards available for rent

After opening back up in April, Morgantown Adventure Outfitters has continued finding success in the Morgantown area.

"We've definitely seen an uptick in participation," said Chad Baker, assistant director at Adventure WV. "They just opened back up for the summer. Now that the word is getting out that it's down there and it's available, they have definitely seen growth over the last summer and even more growth this summer."

Morgantown Adventure Outfitters is an outdoor recreation facility that focuses on providing bike and boat rentals to its customers.

Bikes, kayaks and paddleboards individually rent at \$12.50 per hour. Through this equipment, customers can enjoy outdoor activities while seeing different areas around Morgantown.

Morgantown, where the shop is located next to key destinations. Baker attributes the location to part of why Morgantown Adventure Outfitters is so unique.

"It's super close, right downtown next to Walnut Street," he explained. "It's also one of the few places in the local area where you can get boats and explore the river. It's not something that a lot of people in the past were able to do easily. The fact that they can go explore the river that runs through town for hours is a great opportunity."

Apart from equipment, Morgantown Adventure Outfitters also gives guided trips via kavak or bike. Trained guides will give a tour of certain Morgantown areas, such as the Monongahela River and the Mon River Trail. These trips typically last for about 2.5-3 hours.

Morgantown Adventure Outfitters The main facility is near downtown opened in fall 2022, through a partnership between Adventure WV (an outdoor activity organization at WVU) and the city of Morgantown. The organization really began to see a big increase in participation during summer 2023, when most people usually rent kayaks on the water or ride bikes on local trails.

> According to Baker, Morgantown Adventure Outfitters has many plans for the future, particularly when it comes to expanding its services.

> "They're trying to expand into some family and seasonal programming, as well as some more guided trips for the public to get more involved with," he explained.

> Morgantown Adventure Outfitters is at 10 Walnut St., in Morgantown. Typical hours of operation are from noon.-6 p.m. Friday-Sunday.

### ARTHURDALE HERITAGE

### Many events planned

Arthurdale Heritage has many summer events and offerings.

A new exhibition, Factories in the Fields: an Experiment in Agriculture & Rural Industry, is open, and save the date for the 27th annual New Deal Festival July 13.

Factories in the Fields explores the intersection of subsistence agriculture and rural industry in Arthurdale.

Through President Franklin D. Roosevelt's relief and recovery efforts known as the New Deal, Arthurdale became the first of 99 homestead and resettlement communities in the nation. These homesteads attempted to strike a balance between industry and subsistence agriculture in rural locations. Nicknamed "factories in the fields," this plan encouraged homesteaders to become self-sufficient, acquire new skills and work parttime in manufacturing.

Factories in the Fields features two

historic Co-Op tractors manufactured in the 1930s as well as interactive elements that are fun for all ages.

"As the nation's first New Deal community, Arthurdale has a unique history to share," said Elizabeth Satterfield, curator at Arthurdale Heritage. "This year marks the 90th anniversary of Arthurdale, so we are excited to commemorate this special occasion with a new exhibition."

Arthurdale Heritage will be offering exclusive tours of Factories in the Fields through July 11. The exhibition is free for Preston County residents and Arthurdale Heritage members. For all others, the cost is \$5 for adults and free for children and teens up to 18.





# Jazzy's puts cyclists on the water

Jazzy's Hydrobikes first opened in May 2023.

It was founded on the focus of Morgantown residents enjoying the outdoors and being by the water.

Since then, the company has gone on to have great success in its Star City location.

"Last July was our peak month in rentals," said Charlene Martinez, founder of Jazzy's Hydrobikes. "Last month, we opened back up and we've already hit that peak in our first month."

Martinez credits people sharing their experiences as a big part of why Jazzy's Hydrobikes has gotten so much attention.

"The word of mouth has gotten out, especially on Facebook," she said. "I think a lot of people in the Morgantown area have seen some form of who we are and where we're at on Facebook and other platforms."

At Jazzy's Hydrobikes, customers rent water bikes to explore Star City on the river. The water bikes are well-known for their state-of-the-art design that's hard to find elsewhere.

"They're made for the ocean to with- ness and an expansion of services."

stand waves," Martinez said. "It makes them very stable, and you won't fall off."

Before heading onto the water at Star City, customers are given preparation by the employees.

"We have a few employees that are called Hydrobike Attendants," said Martinez. "They help customers fill out waivers before they rent the hydrobikes, and they go over some safety precautions down at the dock and go over how to work the bike."

Customers can only use the water bikes for a certain amount of time. For a 30-minute trip on the water, the cost is \$15 plus tax per person. If customers wish to extend their trip to an hour — the maximum amount of time customers can have on the water bikes — the cost is \$30 plus tax per person.

For smaller children who can't fit on water bikes, Jazzy's Hydrobikes has paddleboards for parents to rent. It costs \$8 and can be used for 30 minutes on the water.

One of the rewards of renting bikes from Jazzy's Hydrobikes is an offer of either milkshakes or shaved ice after the experience is over. They are conveniently made on location by the employees.

Soon, Jazzy's Hydrobikes is making plans regarding the location of the business and an expansion of services.



"We have an agreement with the town of Star City, so we're going to be there for the next few seasons," said Martinez. "We are looking to maybe have a permanent location near that area and have a brick-and-mortar shop. We are looking to expand our bikes to accommodate larger


